Sharing good practice in SEND

nasen is a leading partner in the Whole School SEND Consortium, which is implementing a large-scale project to improve provision for children and young people with SEND by developing a school-led system of support and collaboration. There are several strands to the project, which is based around the London Leadership Strategy's SEND Review: classroom practice, teaching assistants and transition to adulthood. nasen's role is to set up a forum on the SEND Gateway through which SEND practitioners can easily find research, providers and provision, and share real examples of good practice from schools that will support them with the development of their SEND practice, using the areas in the LLS SEND Review.

How you can help

It is the sourcing of the examples of good practice that we are asking for your help with: we would like as many examples as possible to be available when the new section goes live at the end of March. The examples can be anything at all that you think other professionals could benefit from: word documents, data, reviews of interventions, personal passport frameworks, photographs of displays etc. The process, developed alongside practising SENCOs and teachers, is simple and you should be able to use resources that you already have available.
